## “Working With Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender People”

Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender people are coming out earlier and in greater numbers – a reality that has many ramifications for youth and family service providers, educators, family members, community agencies and others. Often, mental health, health and other human service professionals — however open and accepting they might be — feel little prepared to deal with the issues associated with sexual orientation and gender identity in our culture.

This lively, interactive discussion will offer participants the opportunity to explore the issues; differentiate between personal values and cultural stereotypes which, if unexplored, can significantly impact one’s ability to work effectively with the LGBT population; assess their own and their agencies readiness to effectively serve this population, and develop strategies for providing affirming, culturally inclusive programs and services to LGBTQ youth, adults and families within their agency’s purview.

### LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Increase awareness of the impact that stereotypes and homophobia have on people. Increase awareness of what issues LGBTQ people face.
2. Create a safe space for people to ask questions about LGBTQ issues.
3. Discuss how service providers can be better allies for LGBTQ people clinically and in their organizations.
4. Introduce tools for providing culturally competent services.
