



Rejeana Haynes is Program Director of Outpatient Family Services, Medication Management, and Latino Services at St. Vincent Centers, a private non profit behavioral healthcare organization. She is responsible for managing St. Vincent's Franklinton Office. She has the responsibility of providing oversight of treatment planning and service delivery for children and families. Rejeana also has the responsibility of providing staff development trainings for clinical staff. She manages the budget for each of the programs that she oversees.

Rejeana has worked in the behavioral health care field for the last 17 years. She has dedicated much of her career advocating for culturally competent service delivery in the behavioral healthcare field. She is currently serving as a member and officer (Secretary) of the Board of Directors for the Multiethnic Advocates for Cultural Competence (MACC). She has been a board member of MACC since its inception, 2003. Rejeana wrote one of the original grants that were funded by the Ohio Department of Mental Health as a pilot project to provide mental health services to Hispanic/Latino youth in Franklin County.

Rejeana has continued to advocate for culturally competent services by sitting on special interest committees that advance the concept of cultural competency in behavioral healthcare. She serves as the educational coordinator for student interns at St. Vincent Family Centers. This position has required major coordination efforts with the College of Social Work at The Ohio State University. She also serves on the Advisory Board for the Ohio Hispanic Coalition.

Rejeana completed the L2000+ Leadership Academy through The John Glen Institute for Public Service and Public Policy at The Ohio State University, June 2006 and completed the United Way Project Diversity Program. She holds a Masters degree in Social Work from The Ohio State University.
